## PRO TIP – Kenny Fairbairn

### Rotate on Short Shots

Many players try to bring the club back straight along the target line with an arms-only move.

Instead, I let the clubhead travel on its natural plane on a curve around my body. I rotate my forearms, fold my right elbow and make a very small pivot.

Having this lower body movement is more natural and fluid. My arms aren't swinging the club back; I'm doing that with a slight pivot of the knees and hips, and with forearm rotation.

Try it, it works.
