### Interclub by Christian Holst

I hope you are all enjoying the summer.

We played two matches in early July. We beat Palmares 4-1 at home, lost 1-4 away against Parque da Floresta, and we are currently 4th in our division. Alto seems to be running away a bit, but it is very close between the next 3 or 4 teams, so there is still a lot to play for. Our first match after the summer break will be on 3rd September, away against Carvoeiro.

As I mentioned in the last newsletter, we have been looking into the selection process for the interclub team. It had become clear that a clarification on the process was needed, and the issue was discussed by the Handicap and Competitions Committee before the summer break.

The following principles were agreed:

1. The overriding principle is that main purpose is to win matches. Although there is a social element to the matches, the captain will pick team members and pairings among available players with a view of putting together the strongest team possible.

- 2. The match format is fourball better ball and therefore picking the right pairings and handicap combinations will have a significant bearing on team selection.
- 3. In order to monitor individual player strengths, team members will be expected to play qualifying club competitions on a regular basis. Implicitly, this also gives preference to players who are more regularly available than those who spend less time here.
- A panel of players will be established and regular communication on matches, results and team selection will be posted by e-mail, whether panel members are selected or not. This will increase transparency.
- 5. Other factors of importance will be familiarity of courses (for away matches), as well as general availability and previous results in previous interclub matches.

At the end of the day, the captain of team will have to use his or her discretion, but I trust the above at least address some of the questions I know have been raised.

### Greens Committee by Stewart Harper

As Chairman of the Greens Committee I start this report on behalf of my co members Rie Cherubini and Gordon Todd with an apology as it is longer than I would have preferred and I am conscious that many of you will be sceptical as to what we can achieve.

Firstly I must thank Christophe who has been very positive in responding to our critical assessment as to where the course presents itself against some of our competitors and it is by no means all bad news!

The first decision we made as a Committee was to commission a report from agronomists as to the general condition of the course. Christophe readily agreed and the reports (there were two) proved very informative but were to some extent anticipated. It confirms these simple truths:-

- 1. Kikuyu grass has established itself over the original planted grasses (Bermuda) and this really means only that we need to ensure we work with it. It is of course very common on some exceptional courses in South Africa. The alternative is to dig up all the course (as at Quinta North) and Kikuyu will probably return in any event!
- 2. We have some outbreaks of very bad grasses which need to be destroyed (this has started)
- 3. The bunkers have inconsistent stand and need attention. Management have agreed a two year plan to ensure all bunkers have the same sand and play consistently
- 4. The greens and fairways show poor fertility and some compaction particularly on the fairways

- 5. The irrigation system in some areas has broken down and as of the last few weeks some 50 sprinkler heads are being replaced!
- 6. The greens are showing good root depth (6 inch) but too much sand is possibly reducing fertility and therefore possibly good texture and growth: compaction on the fairways needs addressing. Micro tining the greens has a minimal effect on playability.

Our belief is that our greens remain at their best as good as any on the Algarve. They are in the main firm and can be very fast, which is what we want to achieve. However the monthly slitting and occasional tining has possibly been followed by too much sand rather than we believe (on advise) using a "top dressing" which includes fine soil some natural fertiliser and sand. We must however compliment Sisenando our greens and course manager in presenting a much improved course over the last few weeks and in working often with inadequate man power due to illness etc.

Outside the remit of the agronomists are these further ambitions of your Greens Committee:-

- 1. There should be more definition on the fairways. We should ideally have a first and second cut and a pathway cut from the tee to the fairway through the rough.
- 2. Poor areas under repair should be designated as GUR for competitions
- 3. All the tees can be better with a programme of over seeding and feeding (there has been good progress already) we should like to see over seeding of tees in winter (agreed)
- 4. The new green and bunkers on seven of Olives does not sit well with the rest of the course. Management has agreed to take away many of the pot bunkers and reduce the banking to give a better view for the approach shot and also to give some contouring to the edges of the green to hold balls from inevitably sliding into the water. This will take place this year!

Our belief is that with small but significant maintenance changes we can have a course which will be the envy of others. Needless to say getting irrigation under control is a priority and this is under way.





All golf courses whether they are members clubs or privately owned will from time to time disappoint their members as to the conditions of play. The Algarve has wonderful weather for most but it rains infrequently and has extreme heat and I have discovered there are many diseases and infestations which are very hard to control under the restrictive European chemical rules which apply to Portugal from this year!

We cannot do "miracles" but we are determined to try our best to present a good a course as possible to the members and we are confident Christophe shares this ambition.

I will prepare an up date every month as to how we feel we are progressing. I just hope you will not "shoot the messenger" if progress seems slow!

#### PRO TIP – Kenny Fairbairn Set Up – Toe the Line

We all do it. You check your alignment by placing a club or alignment stick along your toe line. Sometimes, due to us flaring out the left toe back as much as four to five centimetres from the target line, it makes the parallel toe alignment very difficult.

A more precise way to check your alignment is to lay the club along the heels. They remain more on line and will accurately reflect the actual alignment of your feet.
