### **PLEASE repair pitchmarks on green!**

A pitchmark only takes a few seconds to fix correctly, however, a pitchmark repaired incorrectly takes over 3 weeks to heal.

Correct repair will help protect the grass root system and benefit all members and visitors who play the course.



#### **Correct Method**

- ✓ Discard the loose piece of turf taken out by the ball
- ✓ Insert the pitchmark repairer tool just outside the back of the pitchmark
- ✓ Lever the turf towards the centre of the pitchmark
- ✓ Repeat this motion from all sides of the pitchmark

#### What NOT to do

- **× DO NOT** replace the loose piece of turf taken out by the ball. It will die and delay the healing process
- x DO NOT pry up the centre of the depression with the repairer tool as it exposes the soil and will delay the healing process
- **> DO NOT** insert the pitchmark repairer and twist it. This only breaks more turf loose

#### Remember please repair your pitchmark and one other!

#### Handicap Records from Abroad

All members of the club are required to bring their handicap records to the Golf Office when playing competitions in their clubs abroad, so that the Pinheiros Altos EGA handicap can be adjusted accordingly. Any member failing to do so will be in breach of the handicap rules.

## Report from the Greens Committee

In our November report we expressed general optimism based on clear evidence of increased funding for the course, as well as a programme of work which was far more intensive than we had seen for many years. We have said we are not complacent, and we have consistently alerted members to the fact that there is no 'magic wand' to restore the course to its past glories.

#### Where are we now?

The overseeding for both greens and tees has taken place. The spraying for dollar spot has been renewed on certain greens, as it is proving resistant to the earlier single spraying. The overseeding has yet to give the extra growth which we expect, but the next month or so will give a clearer picture. Many of the greens are very much improved. The micro tining and the use of the roller have both led to much smoother and quicker surfaces. We expect this programme to continue. The greens on holes 4-7 on Pines still need more work on removing dollar spot.

The bunker programme continues and most members who have tested the new sand say there is a substantial improvement.

The rough has proved to be a major problem and explanation is called for. In the early months, the Greens Committee asked if we could have a line of definition between the fairway and rough and ideally a first cut of rough of two metres. We expected a very small increase of rough height no more than an inch or inch-and-a-half, but for some reason the rough was allowed to grow to a much greater height (four to five inches in places). Because Kikuyu grass has a tendency to 'thatch' in its base, removing a ball that sinks into the rough is very difficult. This issue slowed play and certainly added to the number of abnormally high scores.

As of now we are seeing the results of intensive mowing helped by additional staff and also some evidence of a 'first cut'. Myself and the committee members are taking opinions from members on whether the rough is now acceptable. We are emphasising that we are a resort course and speed of play is important to us all.

Christophe has agreed a meeting with the agronomist who has prepared a second report. This meeting is to fully understand the essence of his advice and the major issues we have to respond to. That will take place next week.

The course is definitely better than several months ago, but it is not yet at the standard the members expect. I would like to repeat that this process will take time. There is an intensive programme over the next two months and if members wish to see the programme, either Christophe or myself will arrange for a copy to be made available.

Major work of hollow tining on both greens and fairways is planned. We are continuing maintenance of the rough and tidying up of the course through the removal of weeds.

Finally, we wish all a Happy Christmas and prosperous New Year, along with excellent golfing conditions.

# PRO TIP – Peter Ashdown

#### Pre-Shot Routine

#### For improved focus and to avoid mental errors, shorter is better

When it comes to picking the shot and club you're going to hit, don't overthink. Consider the lie, the target and any trouble in your way, but keep it simple. Once you make a decision, focus only on what you need to do. Don't second guess yourself.

If you feel nervous or think your swing is getting a little quick, take one more club and swing smoothly.
